Adolescent Drug Use: Adolescents Are Not Just Small Adults

Adolescence is a time of great change in the brain. The brain is developing at a rapid rate, and it is at this time when a person becomes most vulnerable to addiction. There are real differences between adolescents and adults in terms of how they process information, make decisions, deal with emotions, and choose relationships. When we become frustrated with teens, the problem is not them, it is us. It is our expectations of what we believe they should be able to do that causes us to become frustrated. There is a great deal of science behind prevention and treatment of adolescent drug and alcohol use and substance use disorders. We need to treat adolescents as adolescents, and not just small adults, to be successful.

Afternoon Session: Antonio Smith

Former Ohio State and NFL Player Antonio Smith will deliver the afternoon sessions that is energized and thought provoking for anyone working with at-risk youth.

Leaders, and aspiring leaders, in juvenile corrections will be motivated, inspired and strongly encouraged to enhance their professional mindset, and foster an atmosphere of increased leadership and accountability to their staff, organization and the young men and women they serve. This session will identify and examine the 5 "must have" competencies that every leader in juvenile corrections should develop and demonstrate to increase effectiveness and efficiency in their people, processes and systems! Attendees will participate in discussions around their leadership, communication and conflict styles, and work through an abbreviated DiSC activity that will enhance their awareness of self and others.
